If You Think Your Rights Have Been Violated

We are a private nonprofit organization providing investigative services (testing), advice, advocacy, conciliation, attorney referrals, and community education for Clinton, Eaton, Hillsdale, Ingham, Jackson, Lenawee, Livingston, Monroe, Shiawassee, and Washtenaw counties.

The mission of the FHC is to end discrimination in housing and public accommodations and to promote accessible, integrated communities.

IF YOU HEAR THIS, you may be the victim of housing discrimination:

"You call the police too much"

"Sorry, we just rented the last apartment"

"No disability, we only rent to working people"

"You have to speak English"

"You'll have to end your maternity leave and return to work before we can process your loan application"

"A boy and a girl can't share a bedroom"

"We must have lost your application"

"You might feel more comfortable in another neighborhood"

"Your assistance animal can't be that breed"

"Married people only"

"You can't put a ramp in here"

"You don't look like a woman"

"We only rent to U.S. citizens"

"No previous felonies, arrest records, or misdemeanors"

Housing discrimination is illegal. Know your rights.

The Federal Fair Housing Act

(FHA) prohibits discrimination in housing on the basis of the following protected classes:

- race
- color
- religion
- national origin
- sex*
- · familial status**
- disability
 - * includes sexual harassment, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression or behavior.
 - ** includes children under the age of 18 living with parents or legal custodians, pregnant women, and people securing custody of children under 18.

In Michigan, housing discrimination is prohibited by the Elliott-Larsen Civil Rights Act and the Persons with Disabilities Civil Rights Act. State law includes all federal protections and adds age, marital status, height, and weight.

Local city ordinances may provide additional protections - visit our website for more information.

What Housing is Covered?

The Fair Housing Act covers most housing, including single-family homes, apartments, townhouses, and condominiums. Privately owned and subsidized housing are both covered.

What is Prohibited?

No one may take any of the following actions based on race, color, religion, national origin, sex, familial status, or disability:

In the sale and rental of housing:

- refuse to rent or sell housing;
- refuse to negotiate for housing;
- make housing unavailable;
- · deny a dwelling;
- set different terms, conditions or privileges for sale or rental of a dwelling;
- provide different housing services or facilities;
- falsely deny that housing is available for inspection, sale, or rental;
- for profit, persuade owners to sell or rent (blockbusting); or
- deny anyone access to or membership in a facility or service (such as a multiple listing service) related to the sale or rental of housing.

In mortgage lending:

- · refuse to make a mortgage loan;
- refuse to provide information regarding loans;
- impose different terms or conditions on a loan, such as different interest rates, points, or fees;
- discriminate in appraising property; or
- refuse to purchase a loan or set different terms or conditions for purchasing a loan.

It is Illegal for Anyone to:

- threaten, coerce, intimidate or interfere with anyone exercising a fair housing right or assisting others who exercise that right; or
- advertise or make any statement that indicates a limitation or preference based on race, color, religion, national origin, sex, familial status, or disability.
