DR-4757: Severe Storms, Tornadoes and Flooding

Feb. 20, 2024 ISSUE 1

KEY FACTS

- More than \$2.6 million has already been approved for 682 households.
- More than 1,752 home inspections have been completed.
- Disaster Survivor Assistance crews have visited more than 1,660 homes.
- The deadline to apply for assistance is Monday, April 8, 2024.

KEY MESSAGES

- Michigan residents in Eaton, Ingham, Ionia, Kent, Livingston, Macomb, Monroe, Oakland and Wayne counties with property damage from the Aug. 24-26, 2023 severe storms, tornadoes and flooding can now apply for FEMA assistance.
- If you already made repairs or started your recovery, you can still apply. FEMA inspectors are trained to recognize damage caused by a disaster even after recovery has started.
- FEMA Disaster Survivor Assistance crews are on the ground in Michigan visiting homes, businesses, and nonprofit organizations in affected areas.
